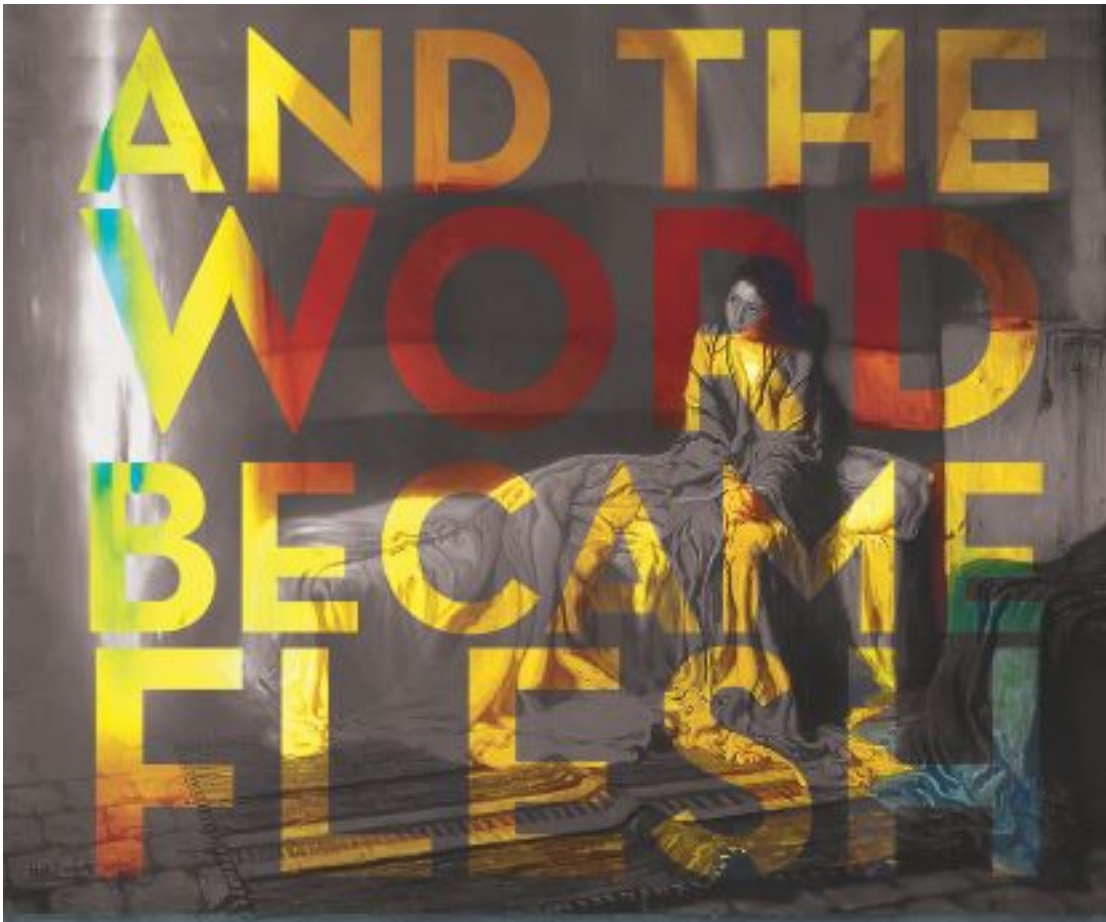


## **General Information:**
